



Sensory bags are now available at the box office in both our venues and include helpful items to reduce overstimulation during your visit to the theatre. Each bag contains:


- Noise-reducing headphones;

### *Xanadu* and Greek Mythological archetypes

The stage musical *Xanadu*, based on the 1980 cult-classic film of the same name, is a vibrant, comedic homage to Greek mythology, infused with the aesthetics of 1980's pop culture. The musical follows the story of Clio, a muse from Mount Olympus, who disguises herself as an Australian roller skater named Kira to inspire a struggling artist, Sonny, to create a roller disco. Through this narrative, *Xanadu* cleverly incorporates Greek mythological archetypes, reinforcing themes of inspiration, artistic ambition, and divine intervention.

At the heart of *Xanadu* is the figure of Clio, an embodiment of the muse archetype. In Greek mythology, the Muses were nine goddesses who inspired creativity in various artistic and intellectual fields. Clio, traditionally the muse of history, takes on a broader role in *Xanadu* as the guiding force behind Sonny's artistic dreams. Her mission reflects the classical notion that divine influence is necessary for true creative expression, a theme prevalent in Greek mythology, where mortals often achieve greatness through the favor of the gods.

Sonny, the struggling artist, represents the archetype of the mortal dreamer, akin to figures like Pygmalion, the sculptor who fell in love with his own creation. Like Pygmalion, Sonny needs divine inspiration to bring his vision to life, and Clio's intervention serves as the catalyst for his transformation. His journey parallels that of heroes like Orpheus, whose artistic talents could bridge the gap between the mortal and divine realms.

The musical also features Melpomene and Calliope, Clio's jealous Muse sisters, who act as the classic trickster

Their schemes to cause Clio's downfall mimic the interference of vengeful deities in myths, such as Hera's relentless torment of Hercules. Their presence underscores the recurring theme in mythology where divine figures test or challenge mortals and fellow deities.

Through its playful use of Greek mythological archetypes, *Xanadu* reinvents ancient themes for a modern audience. By merging the mystical with the absurd, it emphasizes the timeless nature of inspiration and the enduring power of mythology in storytelling, proving that even a roller-disco musical can serve as a vehicle for classical mythology.

Xanadu is a loving send-up of the infamously bad 1980 film of the same title, which has gained longevity through its soundtrack, featuring the Electric Light Orchestra and Olivia Newton

John. Like the film, the stage production celebrates the era's biggest trends—disco, roller skates, and glam rock—with a bit of Greek mythology thrown in! And it's all wrapped up in a story that is both completely ridiculous and entirely sincere.

At its core, this show is about following your dreams, no matter how improbable or ill-advised they may seem. As the show's anthem declares, "A place where nobody dared to go, the love that we came to know, they call it Xanadu." It's a dream that shouldn't exist, but against all odds, it does. That's what makes it so special. (And let's be honest—it's also pretty silly.)

So, grab your leg warmers, and let yourself be swept away. Laugh freely; sing along; lose yourself in the sheer delight of it all. And if we've done our job well, you'll leave the theatre not just entertained but inspired—your heart a little lighter, your dreams a little closer, and your spirit ready to chase whatever magic calls to you.



### *THE 39 STEPS*: FROM FILM NOIR TO STAGE FARCE

Alfred Hitchcock's 1935 film The 39 Steps and Patrick Barlow's 2005 stage adaptation of the same name may share the same source material, but they present vastly different interpretations of the story. Both are based on John Buchan's 1915 novel The Thirty-Nine Steps, a classic espionage thriller that follows protagonist Richard Hannay as he becomes entangled in a dangerous web of spies, murder, and intrigue. While Hitchcock's film embraces the suspense and tension of a gripping mystery, the stage play transforms the story into a fast-paced comedic farce, demonstrating the adaptability and versatility of the narrative across different mediums.

Hitchcock's The 39 Steps is considered one of the director's early masterpieces, establishing themes and techniques that would become hallmarks of his later work. The film follows Richard Hannay, an ordinary man caught in extraordinary circumstances, as he is wrongly accused of murder and must evade both the police and a shadowy spy organization while unraveling the mystery of the "39 Steps." Hitchcock's use of suspense, mistaken identity, and a thrilling chase sequence set the tone for future spy films and noir thrillers.

In comparison, Patrick Barlow's stage adaptation of *The 39 Steps* offers a stark contrast to Hitchcock's serious, tension-filled film. Instead of a conventional thriller, the play presents a slapstick, fastpaced comedic take on the story. Only four actors portray all the characters, two of them often switching roles in hilarious and rapid succession, in the style of Charles Ludlam's The Mystery of Irma Vep.

Despite their contrasting tones, both versions of The 39 Steps successfully captivate audiences by reinterpreting the same story through different lenses. Hitchcock's film remains a landmark in cinematic history, while the stage play's comedic speed and brilliance highlight the narrative's adaptability, proving that a thrilling spy adventure can also be an uproarious farce.

### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

The 39 Steps is a play that delights in contradictions. It's a high-stakes thriller that never takes itself too seriously, a fast-paced farce built on precision, and a grand adventure

made with just a handful of actors and a trunk full of ingenuity. It is both a love letter to Alfred Hitchcock and a joyful send-up of the spy genre, where trench coats and fedoras conceal not just secrets but sight gags and quick changes.

This stage adaptation has its own fascinating history. Originally a 1915 novel by John Buchan, The Thirty-Nine Steps became a beloved 1935 Hitchcock film, setting the template for the "wrong man" thriller. In 2005, playwright Patrick Barlow took that suspenseful story and reimagined it for the stage with just four actors playing over 150 roles. First premiering in London before making its way to Broadway and beyond, Barlow's version embraces theatrical invention, turning the film's high-speed chases, train escapes, and espionage into a gleeful display of comedic ingenuity.

Adding to the playful theatricality of our production, we're staging The 39 Steps in-the-round—an exciting challenge that surrounds the action with the audience, pulling them even deeper into the world of the play. But for all its danger and intrigue, there is also a love story. Richard Hannay and Pamela, two people who have never truly loved anyone, find themselves handcuffed together-literally and metaphorically. And yet, amidst all the danger and derring-do, they miraculously discover the beating of their own true hearts—proof that even in a world of spies and secrets, connection is the greatest adventure of all.

This is the kind of storytelling that thrives at Creede Repertory Theatre. It asks actors to be Olympic-level shape-shifters, designers to turn simplicity into spectacle, and audiences to join in the game, using their imagination to complete the illusion. It's a play that reminds us why we love live theatre—because we get to witness the impossible being made possible, right in front of us.

We hope you laugh, lean in, and let yourself be swept up in the

### WONDER WHERE THESE THINGS

The original production of *The Fantasticks* ran for a total of 42 years and 17,162 performances. Inspired by a combination of Shakespeare, commedia dell'arte, and the "Beat Writers Movement," the musical premiered on May 3, 1960. In 1969, The Fantasticks was the first musical ever produced by Creede Repertory Theatre, directed by Neal Fenter. Including our current production, we have produced the show four times, more than any other show on the Creede Rep stage. The show was produced again in 1978 with the same director. In 2002, the third production at Creede Rep opened the same year that the original Off-Broadway production closed. With CRT favorites Annie Butler, Logan Ernstthal, Renee Prince, and Peggy Pharr Wilson in the cast, it was another well-loved production. And now here you are, sitting in the Ruth Humphreys Brown Theatre, ready to see our fourth production. Round and round it goes.

### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

"Round and round, 'Neath a magic spell... Life is a colorful carousel."

And here we are in 2025, coming full circle, revisiting this magical, colorful, and timeless American classic for CRT's 60th season.

When discussing The Fantasticks, it's hard

for me not to draw parallels with another classic of the American stage (and one of my favorites): Thornton Wilder's Our Town. Wilder's play was an important influence on writers Tom Jones and Harvey Schmidt as they began drafting their now-famous and longrunning musical. Jones and Schmidt even adapted Wilder's play into a musical, Grover's Corners. The similarities are striking: a simple yet imaginative set; a central "master of ceremonies"; a girl and a boy who fall in love; and the parents who love them. Both deal thematically with the illusions and realities of love and the time it takes to learn the difference—the cycle of life reveals itself to be a complicated but beautiful ride. Like all good stories or allegories, these tales provide different lessons to us depending on our age. In the case of The Fantasticks, if we are young, we may see ourselves as Matt and Luisa; when we're parents, Bellomy and Hucklebee. I certainly recognize myself at times in Henry and Mortimer! The story takes Matt and Luisa round and round this enchanting and at times frightening life and brings them, and us, full circle to whomever and whenever we are. Beneath the whimsical romanticism, the theatrical magic, and the seasonal and cyclical imagery lies a simple but universal story about our journey through life, with all its joys and sorrows and the lessons we learn. Life can be a colorful carousel, but it can also be reckless and cruel, and like a carousel, things that go round and round by definition come full circle, and we, hopefully, arrive a little wiser. And that is why by the end of our ride we hopefully recognize that,

### LEAVITT'S LAW: MEASURING THE UNIVERSE

Although she contributed one of the most important discoveries to modern astronomy, few of us have heard of Henrietta Leavitt. Playwright Lauren Gunderson set out to bring recognition and understanding to Leavitt's story after reading about her in a book by George Johnson, Miss Leavitt's Stars: The Untold Story of the Woman Who Discovered How to Measure the Universe. Gunderson says, "I love stories of women in science and immediately was shocked that I didn't know who this woman was. What really made me want to write a play about Henrietta however is that her story was not only about one brilliant woman but an entire cohort of women who [were] Harvard 'computers.' This was a story about a sisterhood."

Silent Sky seeks to share the story of the discoveries of these brilliant women. Famed American astronomer Edwin Hubble also believed Leavitt's discoveries deserved recognition; he attempted to nominate her for a Nobel Prize in 1925 but was unable to after learning that she had died three years earlier—the Nobel Prize is not awarded posthumously.

Silent Sky is not a tragic tale of lost acknowledgment however. Gunderson characterizes the play in a different, more inspiring way. "This play is about the glory and hard work of science. It is a story of family, both the ones we are born with and the ones we choose. It's the story of sisterhood and, yes, a little bit of old-fashioned boy meets girl as well." Leavitt's work lives on in the inspiration to seek discovery, to ask questions, and to always look up in wonder.

### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

When we began discussions for the design of *Silent Sky*, we excitedly spoke of the allencompassing expanse of the cosmos and the grandeur of the halls of Harvard. Both need to exist and often change at a moment's notice. A wild, ethereal mystery that jumps to sturdy dark woods and old rare books. A true challenge

given to us by the brilliant Lauren Gunderson.

Then the truth of history hit me square in the face. These women were not allowed anywhere near the prestige of Harvard's lecture halls or *in* the observatory itself. Instead, they were crammed into a small room, with the most basic tools, and asked to undertake the painstaking task of mapping the stars—all on a salary equivalent to the lowest laborer at a factory.

What happens to us, as people, when we lock these stories away or when we credit others who seem more "appropriate"? We are robbed of the magnificent, diverse truth of our rich history and the giant kaleidoscope of humanity that gave it to us. We are denied inspiration and strength from the most unlikely places! All of us have our own stories of passion, dedication, and overcoming obstacles, and by sharing them, we may just inspire someone to go forward after feeling hopeless. That is what makes *Silent Sky* so exquisite.

The plain truth is a beautiful gift for us to slowly unravel and delve into with joy. It's where we find our connection to one another under the same sky and all its brilliant mysteries. There's hardship and pain, but there's also daring, humor, love, rebelliousness, candor, and sheer determination fueled by passion. In this production, we soak up every bit. How lucky are we to jump on this ride and peek into the life of Henrietta Swan Leavitt as she makes one of science's greatest discoveries? Theatre gives us that gift, taking us anywhere and everywhere. Here's to a future of unfurling, seeking, and discovering through all the stunning voices of a planet filled with souls who were told "no" but were determined to do it anyway.



# **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

"We are such stuff as dreams are made on." (The Tempest, Act 4, Scene 1)

When trying to decide on a show for our 23rd annual KID Show program, I felt compelled to look back. For the past five years that I've been involved, I've seen students taking on

huge challenges and meeting them with grace, artistry, and what has truly felt like a little bit of magic. They've performed outside (twice!); they've made larger-than-life puppets; they've fought with swords; they've danced and sung...it seems to me they've tackled all the essential elements of a Shakespeare play. So...we should just go ahead and do a Shakespeare play, right? Right!

I am thrilled that KID Show's first foray into classical text is happening on the Mainstage during our 60th anniversary season. Shakespeare is for everyone, and some of my most transformative moments as an artist and as an educator have happened with young people and Shakespeare—you haven't lived until you've had a whole class chanting "O, for a muse of fire!" at the top of their lungs!

The Tempest was the first show I worked on as a teaching artist for theatre. I was lucky enough to be an assistant director on a Shakespeare-for-young-actors program in 2014. Prospero's Island has so much to uncover: betrayal and a quest for power, young love, magic and spirits, and to start the whole thing off with a bang, a shipwreck! # FROM THE FOUNDERS...

Our founding members are often asked, "What role did theatre play in your life after 1966?" Here, seven founders answer for themselves, two answer with help from others, and three who have passed are remembered by those who knew them best. Some of the founders are in Creede this summer to celebrate the 60th season with you in person. All 12 of them are here in spirit to wish CRT the best for the next 60 years.



### **Steve Grossman** 1966, '67, '87, '89, '91

After directing productions in the first two CRT seasons ("Operation Summer Theatre," 1966 and '67), I graduated from KU, then left for the Peace Corps. I was posted to Malaysia, where I taught English in a rural primary school for two years, followed by a year on the Peace Corps training staff. Then magazine and newspaper journalism in the US, Canada, and Mexico. Along the way, I married and helped raise a wonderful daughter. Many skills I acquired in theatre work, especially leadership skills, have served me well in my professional life, but theatre as an art form didn't reenter my life until the late 1980s and early '90s, when Artistic Director Richard Baxter kindly allowed me to direct four CRT productions, which reignited my passion. I returned to KU for an MA in theatre and film and have since taught and directed at the university level and freelance-directed around the country. These days, I'm mostly retired, but when I can get the work, I teach acting and direct plays.



### Joe Roach 1966, '68

After my two summers in Creede (1966, 1968) but before my retirement from Yale as Sterling Professor of Theater 50 years later, I had the good fortune to keep on doing plays with students the same age that most of the founders were in 1966. So, you might say that I never had to grow up, except that I also had to write about the plays I directed and produced, as well as others, which is a stimulating part of the job description for my line of work. A life spent constantly learning new things to teach students who are always aged 18–22 is a life that I thank my lucky stars I got to live. But among the many important lessons I learned as a teenager during that astonishing first summer in Creede, the one I am proudest to have passed on to successive generations of gifted young people is this: miracles are labor-intensive.





### **Kay Habenstein Lancaster** 1966–'69, 1971–'75

After the successful 1966 Creede theatre summer, I returned to Kansas University and continued my theatre graduate studies. The first company, now called "The Founders," met frequently with Steve Grossman and planned for the 1967 season. I am the only female from 1966 who returned in 1967. I continued to act and direct at CRT in 1967–'69 and 1970–'75. In total, I acted in 36 plays and directed nine for CRT during my nine years. The experience walks with me still, and I travel to Creede every year to watch the shows and marvel at the growth and remember its history and beloved townsfolk. The CRT experience guides my memories and sets me on fire. I live in Charlottesville, VA, with my husband of 40 years, Charles Lancaster, who proposed to me on Uncompahgre Peak. Our son, John, is 38. I completed an MA degree at UVA, taught kindergarten for 30 years, and became the president of Charlottesville Children's Theatre, sang with Charlottesville Light Opera Company, and tilled a large vegetable garden. Now I volunteer with the Salvation Army, Books Behind Bars, African Development Partners, IRC, St. Paul's Memorial Church, and Creede's Ladies Aid Society. I'm still here!

### Gary Mitchell 1966–'67, 1971–'72, 2011

In May 1966, I graduated from KU with a double major—English and theatre (with honors)—and joined the first Creede theatre season, the "old man" in the troupe (at 21). After that summer, I eventually finished my MA; taught in a rural high school in Fiji (Peace Corps 1968–'70) where I established their library, now named after me; and came back home to Independence, KS, to teach English and theatre at the community college for 31 years. I've acted in many local productions, directed 31 shows, continued working at CRT, and have been involved with the William Inge Theatre Festival since its start in 1982. In fact, last April the festival honored playwright Lauren Gunderson, whose *Silent Sky* is part of this CRT season. It's an awesome play. I kept a journal the first season, combining my two majors in a way. I also took photos, now historic. My fellow founders and little Creede town are so much a part of my life. I feel like a proud parent witnessing how mature, accomplished, and thriving our theatre infant has grown. Happy 60th season!

### Pat Royse Moynihan 1966

Being a member of The Founders in '66 offered me a lesson in discipline and hard work while making lifelong friends. After graduating from KU in '67, I performed at the Starlight Theatre in Kansas City for two seasons. I lived in NYC briefly, where I studied voice and acting. From there, I traveled with a USO troupe to Thule Air Base in Greenland. Then on to California where I performed in *Kismet* (Dorothy Chandler Pavilion) and *Madame Butterfly* (The Greek Theatre). The latter took me to Manila in '82 with the Los Angeles Opera Company. In '87, I had the honor of singing the national anthem at a Dodgers game for Santa Clarita night, my hometown. I enjoyed being a cast member of a repertory murder mystery group for 10 years while I was also a cantor and choir director at my church. I have been married to a wonderful man for 54 years and have three children and four grandchildren. I realize now that that summer in Creede was a great foundation for all that I pursued in my theatrical life. I look back with affection and am grateful to Steve Grossman for giving me that chance.









### Steve Reed 1966–'69, 1973–'75

Looking back 60 years, I am struck by how Creede, its magnificent mountains, and CRT have shaped the trajectory of my life. My theatre career started here. My second career, in botany, started here. I met my wife, Carolyn, here. And the friends I made here are among the dearest of my life. The directing skills I developed here served me well when I made the jump to New York. I loved the Off-Off-Broadway scene, working in downtown theatres like LaMama, directing new plays by talented young writers. But eventually the magic faded, and I found myself at a crossroad. Visiting Creede in the summer of 1986, I started exploring the mountains and discovered a new passion, the incredible world of mountain wildflowers. Also that summer, I met Carolyn. I convinced her to move to New York with me. She convinced me, after four years, to move back west. In the interim, I got a botany degree and a new career as a wildflower botanist. I am now retired, living with Carolyn in Santa Fe, visiting Creede every summer, renewing old friendships that seem fresh every year. Creede—the theatre, the friends, the mountains—I could not ask for more.

### Connie Bohannon-Roberts 1966

In 1966 I graduated from KU and, that summer, helped start our theatre in Creede. Soon after arriving and seeing those incredible mountains, we knew something magical was happening. After that, I completed a masters in theatre from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. I also launched Prairie Mama Productions, where I created four one-woman shows (Seven Women, Universal Child, Calamity Jane—An Indomitable Shameless Hussy, and Sky Enough to Grow) that I performed at colleges, universities, and state and national conferences. During my career in education, I taught high school and middle school theatre. I developed support programs for atrisk students and served as a gifted-education facilitator. In 1998-'99 I was notified that KU honor students had chosen me as an outstanding teacher and mentor. Over all these years, the Creede experience has provided inspiration for my work. Steve Grossman: thank you for your leadership. Creede folks: thank you for welcoming and loving 12 kids from KU. And I thank all of you who have continued to grow this CRT miracle. I am in awe.

### BJ Myers 1966, '68, '70, 1974-'83

"I don't think any of us had had time to realize what an amazing thing we had done," Betty Jean Myers said when she reviewed the experience of starting a theatre in Creede. "We were just too busy doing it." In the summer of 1966, nobody was busier than BJ, now retired and living in Pueblo. She designed sets, lights, costumes, props, and sound for five shows in rotating rep, while serving as her own shop foreman, master electrician, and stage manager. BJ spent much time in Creede, first as designer/ technical director, then financial director, and finally as managing director (1980-'83). Later, she comanaged the El Paso Cultural Planning Project. Returning to Creede, she and her business partner opened the Abbey Lane Gallery, an elegant addition to Main Street. "I became a permanent resident of Creede in 1972 and have loved not only the theatre but also the town," she reminisced. "I know I am one of the luckiest people in the world to be a part of both these communities." Creede reciprocated by electing her town mayor in 2000. She married the love of her life, Bill Kuhlke in 2005. —contributed by Joe Roach & Katherine Brennand









### **Shari Morey** 1966, '68

From an early age, Shari showed a love for theatre. She organized performances among her childhood playmates and was an active thespian in high school. In college, she traveled with her KU classmates to Creede.

In Creede, Shari had freedom to create, build, and explore. She made lifelong friendships; she pushed herself mentally and physically to create something that did not exist before. She fell deeply in love and married Joe Roach, a handsome poet who won her heart. Shari went on to study at Ithaca College where she earned a degree in journalism. Sadly, the romance with Joe did not last. She stayed in New York and became a teacher. She taught debate and wrote ad copy on the side. A big break landed her a job in TV advertising. She left the ad game and joined Chicago City Hall as a recruiter until retiring in 2017.

Juggling work and motherhood never stopped Shari from performing with theatre groups throughout her life until one round of Shakespeare in the Park during a particularly brutal Chicago heat wave caused her to retire permanently into the audience.

Shari currently lives in Ohio. She enjoys mysteries, crossword puzzles, and her great-grandchildren. —contributed by Adrianne Roach

### Lance Hewett 1966–'67





Lance began his theatrical career as a boy puppeteer in New Jersey, producing entertainments for the neighborhood. He moved to Kansas in his teens, enrolling at KU as a theatre student. In 1966 he became a founding member of the Creede Repertory Theatre, designing, building, and acting. He was back in 1967, moving shortly thereafter to New York where he played Edward Rutledge in the road company of 1776 with Howard da Silva as Ben Franklin. The theatre critic of *The Washington Post* wrote, "The performance that sticks in the mind is that of Lance Hewett as Edward Rutledge of South Carolina [who] held up the Declaration until the noble and hypocritical slavery passage was stricken.... Historically and dramatically the role is an uncomfortable one, and Hewett makes it resonate with the irony of a free nation built largely on slavery and the tragedy to which it will lead fourscore and seven years later." Lance toured in A Christmas Carol with John Carradine and, in 1996, cofounded the Isle of Shoals theatre company in New York, directing, designing, and acting for the next 19 years, winning four New York Innovative Theatre Awards. Lance died in February of 2015. —contributed by Phil Grecian

### David Miller 1966-'67, '69

Turning impasses into breakthroughs—when opening the show on time looked impossible— David's spontaneous inventions lit up rehearsals in 1966. No one who was there will forget his comic showstoppers in each of his five roles or George Gibbs's soul-searing sob as he knelt at Emily's grave in Our Town. After returning to Creede for the 1967 and 1969 seasons, David experienced a series of health crises that ultimately put him in continuing care. But encouraged by his devoted family and regularly corresponding with his admiring friends, he always kept the phenomenal theatre of his mind open. A letter from David was an event, and he energized everyone, especially those who loved him the longest. His sister Betsy Randle recalls: "As a mere sophomore in high school, I was hearing stories from Dave about Creede and his beloved team of actors, drama students who were EAGER to play. And play they did, inspiring me to do the same! My brother gave me some pretty remarkable memories of his life in Creede and finally my own! Singing in The Fantasticks (1969) was a dream come true for me. Thank you, Davy, for sharing Creede with me, your baby sister." —contributed by Joe Roach & Betsy Miller Randle







### Earl Trussell 1966-'67, 1974-'75

The gift of faith came to Earl late in life. Between his four seasons at CRT, KU Theatre honored him with the coveted "Kilty Kane," recognizing its top graduating student. After his successes in college and his numerous roles at CRT, including the leading man in 1974's The Philadelphia Story, his periodically interrupted journey included appointments as visiting actor at Sweet Briar College, instructor of business communications at Pace University, and acting and directing in New York's Off-Broadway theatre scene. In between, he struggled, until he learned to accept a power in life greater than himself. Joining the congregation of Christ's Church in Rye, NY, Earl served as chalice bearer, lector, and vestry member. Recognizing his vocation, his church sent him on a mission to teach English in Les Cayes, Haiti. There, he found his true purpose in life, "teaching Haitians who would go on to become leaders in the community." Illness cut short his ministry, but his reawakened spirit reminded those who knew him that first summer in Creede of his electrifying performance as Starbuck, the title role in *The Rainmaker*, whose soliloguy on the power of belief ends with, "And me? I'm ridin' through the rainbow!" — contributed by Joe Roach & Steve Reed

### JOHN DAVID LENTZ MEMORIAL **ENDOWMENT FUND**

John David Lentz was a muchbeloved company member at Creede Repertory Theatre in 1992. After the conclusion of the season,

John traveled to San Diego where he was enrolled in a master of fine arts theatre program at the University of San Diego. John completed his MFA requirements on April 29, 1994, but was killed in a random shooting on May 1, 1994, as he and a friend walked across the Balboa Park bridge after a play at the Old Globe Theatre.

In 2015, a five-year campaign was launched to permanently endow the John David Lentz Memorial Fund at CRT. In partnership with CRT, John's family and friends have worked tirelessly to ensure that the fund continues to honor John's life and share his love of theatre long into the future. This summer, the John David Lentz Memorial Fund sponsors *The 39 Steps*.






### THE GENNY BASLER MEMORIAL FUND was founded in memory of Genny

Basler, a longtime Creede resident and lover of Creede Repertory Theatre. Genny saw her first show at Creede Repertory Theatre in 1993, the summer after her nephew John David Lentz was a member of the CRT company, and from the moment the lights went up, she was hooked. Genny and her family have been regulars in the CRT audience every summer. In the summer of 2003, she and her husband, Tom, retired to Creede and became much more than regulars—they became part of the CRT family. Genny was an early

member of the Creede chapter of the Friends of CRT and, as president of the Ladies Aid Society in Creede, orchestrated many tech dinners to feed CRT company members. Her presence was always felt at CRT as a regular volunteer, patron, and friend. On June 19, 2017, Genny and her husband were returning to Creede from the valley when their car was struck by an oncoming vehicle on Highway 160 just west of Monte Vista. Genny was killed instantly. A longtime supporter and friend of Creede Repertory Theatre, Genny was beloved by all, and her presence in the CRT audience will be forever missed. Donations made to CRT in Genny's name will be entered into the memorial fund to help support future CRT shows.

### PLAYWRIGHTS & COMPOSERS

Patrick Barlow

Playwright - The 39 Steps

Patrick is an Olivier-nominated playwright known for his adaptations of Ben Hur, A Christmas Carol, and The 39 Steps, which has played in over 40 countries, winning Olivier, Helpmann, Molière, and Tony Awards. His rewriting of Milton's Comus was critically acclaimed at Shakespeare's Globe. In the UK, he founded the National Theatre of Brent, creating award-winning comedy epics. His screenwriting credits include Van Gogh, Revolution!! and the BAFTA-winning The Young Visiters. As an actor, he's appeared in Shakespeare in Love, Notting Hill, and more. He is currently adapting The Hound of the Baskervilles and Dracula for the stage.

Douglas Carter Beane Book - Xanadu

Douglas is a Tony-nominated playwright, screenwriter, and musical theatre writer. His Broadway plays include The Nance, The Little Dog Laughed, and As Bees in Honey Drown. He wrote the film To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything, Julie Newmar and the books for musicals Rodgers + Hammerstein's Cinderella, Xanadu, Sister Act, and Lysistrata Jones. His work has been staged at the Metropolitan Opera, Radio City Music Hall, and London's West End. Beane is married to composer Lewis Flinn, and they have two children, Cooper and Gabrielle.

John Buchan

Author - The 39 Steps

John Buchan (1875–1940) was a Scottish author, historian, and politician, best known for his adventure novels. His most famous work, The Thirty-Nine Steps (1915), introduced the character Richard Hannay and helped define the spy genre. Buchan's literary career spanned various genres, including historical fiction and nonfiction. He served as the Governor General of Canada from 1935 to 1940, a role that solidified his political influence. A prolific writer, he also authored essays, biographies, and poems. Buchan's blend of suspense, adventure, and social commentary made him a prominent figure in early twentieth-century British literature.

John Farrar

Music & Lyrics - Xanadu

John left Australia in 1970 to join the legendary English group The Shadows, recording six albums with them. During a break, he began working with Olivia Newton-John, producing 14 albums and winning a Grammy for "I Honestly Love You." After moving to LA, he wrote and produced many of her hits, including "Have You Never Been Mellow," "Hopelessly Devoted to You" (Oscarnominated), "You're the One That I Want," and "Physical." In 1995, he cowrote songs for the Cliff Richard musical Heathcliff and later collaborated with Francis Ford Coppola on the musical Gidget.

Lauren Gunderson

Playwright - Silent Sky

Lauren is an acclaimed American playwright, screenwriter, and author. Born in Atlanta, GA, she earned her BA in creative writing from Emory University and an MFA in dramatic writing from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. Since 2015, she has been among America's most produced playwrights, topping the list in 2022-2023. Her notable works include I and You, The Book of Will, and Silent Sky. Gunderson is a two-time recipient of the Steinberg/ ATCA New Play Award and has received the Lanford Wilson Award. She resides in San Francisco with her husband, virologist Nathan Wolfe, and their two children.

Tom Jones (Book & Lyrics) Harvey Schmidt (Music)

The Fantasticks

Tom and Harvey were the legendary composer-lyricist duo behind The Fantasticks, the longest-running production in American-theatre history. Their Broadway shows include 110 in the Shade and I Do! I Do! They explored innovative musical forms with Celebration and Philemon, winning an Outer Critics Circle Award. Their work also includes Colette Collage, The Show Goes On, and Mirette. Honored with an Obie, a Special Tony Award, and induction into the Broadway and Songwriters Halls of Fame, the duo has an enduring legacy. Jones passed away on August 11, 2023.

Jeff Lynne

Music & Lyrics - Xanadu

Jeff formed Electric Light Orchestra (ELO) in the 1970s, leading the band to international success with platinum albums like A New World Record and Out of the Blue. After disbanding ELO in 1986, he focused on production, working with George Harrison (Cloud Nine), Roy Orbison (Mystery Girl), and Tom Petty. As "Otis Wilbury" in the Traveling Wilburys, he collaborated with Orbison, Harrison, Petty, and Bob Dylan. Lynne also worked with Brian Wilson and coproduced the Beatles' Free as a Bird and Real Love, as well as Paul McCartney's Flaming Pie in 1997.

William Shakespeare

Playwright - *The Tempest*Word wizard of the Elizabethan era, William penned epic plays, tragic tales, and sonnets smoother than Romeo's pickup lines. From the ghostly drama of Hamlet to the magical mischief of A Midsummer Night's Dream, his work shaped English literature forever. Rumor has it he invented over 1,700 words—probably while sipping ale and dodging deadlines. Part poet, part playwright, all legend.

Musical Theatre International

Music Theatre International (MTI) is a leading theatrical licensing agency, granting rights to perform Broadway and international musicals. Founded in 1952 by Frank Loesser and Don Walker, MTI supports over 100,000 theatres in the US and 150+ countries by providing official scripts, music, and resources. offers Broadway Junior® musicals for young performers and School Editions for high schools. Headquartered in New York City, with offices in London and Melbourne, MTI continues to advance musical theatre as a dynamic art form worldwide.


Michael Perlman

CHARLENE 1946-2025

Founding Board Member 1978–'94, 2005–'10


Charlene saw her first CRT show on the

Mainstage in 1968 and became an instant fan. She and her then-husband, Stephen Quiller, opened the Pen & Quill art gallery on Main Street in 1970. The upstairs of that same building housed the theatre actors. Charlene became their friend, their confidante, their "shoulder to cry on."The theatre friendships she developed in those early years lasted a lifetime. She was on CRT's Board of Trustees not once but twice, and her combined 20+ years of service far surpasses that of any other board member. She was a tireless advocate for a close relationship between CRT and the Creede community, believing their futures were strongly intertwined.

Charlene's involvement in Creede was allencompassing: co-owner of San Juan Sports with husband and soulmate, George Ameel; beloved home economics teacher at the high school; a leading member of the Creede Arts Council; and on and on. One of Charlene's enduring legacies is the National Small Print Show, which she managed for many years, partnering with CRT to host the show in the theatre's Mainstage lobby every year in May.

It is no exaggeration that Charlene knew every person in town. One of her close theatre friends, Rebecca Green ('71-'73), remembers the year she and Charlene entered the annual Snowshoe Shuffle. Rebecca was hoping for a respectable finish, but she did not count on meeting other folks along the way. Charlene, of course, stopped to talk to everyone. Inevitably, they finished last (but with lots of laughter). Her passing has elicited an outpouring of love and memories, including this from another of her many theatre friends, CRT founder Kay Lancaster, "My memory spins and tumbles...1973 sharing long talks in the Pen & Quill, laughing...talking art, theatre, town folks...then, years later, delivering senior lunch to Charlene every day for the summer...seeing her sitting in her walker...the long last embrace...'

**NAGLE** 1936-2024

Director, Playwright 2009-'14 It still seems preposterous to me that someone as accomplished in the theatre

as Nagle Jackson agreed to come to Creede. He was a big-league director and an award-winning playwright, a towering figure in the regional theatre movement that took hold in the 1960s and flourished for decades. As Artistic Director of Milwaukee Repertory Theatre, McCarter Theatre, and later Associate Artistic Director of the Denver Center Theatre Company in the '90s and early 2000s, he shaped the American theatre landscape. He directed plays across the country, on Broadway, and around the world. He was a celebrated playwright, an international award winner, a translator of Molière, a director, and a dramaturg.


And yet, Nagle came to Creede for a song. But in every rehearsal, production meeting, and conversation, he showed us what it meant to be a consummate professional. His presence elevated the work, leaving an indelible mark on CRT and deepening the artistic ambition of our company.

He directed many of my favorite CRT productions, including The Road to Mecca; The Imaginary Invalid (his own translation); Everything in the Garden; Fools; The Ladies Man; and Ghost Light (his play). CRT also produced his works The Quick-Change Room: Scenes from a Revolution and This Day and Age. A champion of new voices, he played a key role in shaping the Headwaters New Play Festival, helping to establish CRT as a relevant force in the national theatre scene.

Beyond his artistic contributions, Nagle was simply a delightful man. His presence was steady, his demeanor gentle, and his respect for actors profound. He approached them with trust, allowing them to find their own way into a role without manipulation. He was a director producers, designers, actors, and technicians loved working withalways impeccably prepared, endlessly knowledgeable, and deeply collaborative. As I've matured as a theatre artist, I've come to realize that Nagle was the kind of director I aspire to be.

### BILL KUHLKE 1929–2024


The University of Kansas Professor of Theatre 1960–1994 Actor, 2004

Creede lost a remarkable citizen

in Bill Kuhlke last July. Toward the end of his academic career at KU, he was honored by the state of Kansas with its highest distinction for a professor, the Distinguished Teacher of Humanities Award. Bill was a fierce advocate for the arts and for theatre's potential to teach us about ourselves and our neighbors. He believed, he taught, and he exemplified this in his everyday life. I was a student at KU when Bill was teaching, and I could see that, in addition to his sensitivity and intelligence, he was also admired in a rock star kind of way. He was the theatre department's dreamboat professor, but he was not a ladies man. He saved his love and care for his wife, Glennys. His acting skill was legendary, but I never had the opportunity to work with him onstage at KU.

After retirement, he spent time in DC with his daughter's family as nanny for his granddaughters. Some years after Glennys's death, he reconnected with his old student and CRT founder, BJ Myers. I was thrilled to be invited to officiate their wedding. Bill became a valued citizen of Creede. In 2004, CRT invited him to perform in *The Cripple of Inishmaan*, and it was that production that finally gave me the chance to be onstage with this great man. He was, as expected, wonderful in his role as Johnnypateenmike, but at the end of the run, he admitted it was too terrifying to maintain the lines and he would never venture onto the stage again.

He and BJ lived happily in a little house behind the theatre until health problems caused them to move to a lower altitude. He was revered by his students and admired by all who were fortunate enough to see him onstage. From his teaching days to his final brilliant performance, everyone who was lucky enough to cross paths with Bill was better for it. —*Christy Brandt*, *CRT Company Member of 51 years*



It was then that Gary and I really got to know each other; aside from the office tasks of managing budgets and nurturing our newly formed board of trustees, Gary and I spent weeks together on the audition circuit, from city to city—Denver, Dallas, Kansas City, and other exotic locations. We shared a love of musical theatre (we must have listened to the *A Chorus Line* cast album a thousand times that winter); of great books; and of predicting what we'd each be doing in 10 or 20 years. And we spent *a lot* of time laughing—about our families, about the challenges of being gay in a world that was just beginning to accept that, and about the general state of the world in the Jimmy Carter years. It was an exhilarating time, and Gary quickly became not only my assistant but my friend.

I left Creede at the end of the next season, and Gary stayed on, becoming even more instrumental to the growing success of CRT; for a time, we kept up with each other (harder to do in those pre-Facebook days) but grew apart as we each moved on to other ventures, other chapters. The news of his passing was a profound shock to me, as it was to everyone who knew and loved Gary. But I'm thankful to have those wonderful memories of him—quiet, reserved, charmingly subversive, and absolutely unique. —*Steve Scott*, '70, '72–'73, '75–'80
